

crops; or (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048, Natural Resource Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resource Code.


All variances from this Order require the following conditions be met:

1. The Crosby County Emergency Management Coordinator, Precinct Commissioner or Fire Chief for the area will check the site prior to burning.
2. Both the Fire Chief and Elected County Official must agree that wind conditions do not exceed 10 mph and that all easily combustible materials have been cleared to within a safe distance form the approved activity; and
3. The County Sheriff or Chief Deputy Sheriff must be notified by the Elected County Official that this activity is approved prior to commencement.
4. No burning in Crosby County South of FM 40, East of FM 651 and North of FM 193.

In accordance with Local Government Code §352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C Misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of up to \$500.00.

The purpose of this Order is the mitigation of the public safety hazard posed by wildfires during the current drought and severe weather conditions by restricting use of combustible materials.






