

INFORMATION FOR FILING A DIVORCE – PRO SE

THE DISTRICT CLERK’S OFFICE DOES NOT SUPPLY THE LEGAL FORMS NECESSARY TO FILE FOR DIVORCE. WE ARE NOT ATTORNEY’S AND ARE LEGALLY PROHIBITED FROM GIVING ANY LEGAL ADVICE.

If you intend to represent yourself “Pro Se” (without the assistance of an attorney), you must have knowledge to prepare and file the necessary pleadings and present your case to the Court. You can find state approved legal forms at no cost at www.texaslawhelp.org.

PROCEDURES FOR FILING YOUR OWN DIVORCE:

1. Bring your original petition and two additional copies to the District Clerk’s office to be filed.
2. The filing fees are: Divorce -spouse signs a waiver of service.....\$360.00
Divorce with citation in Crosby County\$433.00

ALL FEES ARE DUE AT THE TIME OF FILING

(If you are unable to afford court costs, a “Statement of Inability to Afford Payment of Court Costs” is available at www.co.crosby.tx.us under Quicklinks>District Court>District Clerk’s page.)

3. Your petition will be filed and assigned a cause number. Please have this information available when contacting our office concerning your case.
4. The District Clerk’s phone number is 806-675-2071. Our office hours are 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. and closed from 12:00 P.M. to 1:00 P.M. for lunch.
5. The petition must be on file for at least 60 days before the final hearing can be held.
6. You will need to schedule a hearing date by calling Lisa Harden, Court Coordinator, at 806-775-1041.
7. On the day of the final hearing, you will need to bring three copies of your prepared Final Decree of Divorce. A fee will be required for any additional copies. You will also need the completed vital statistics form, which can be picked up at the District Clerk’s office or also can be found on the District Clerk’s page at www.co.crosby.tx.us.
8. Your hearing will be held in the 72nd District Courtroom, located on the 2nd floor in the Courthouse. Be seated in the courtroom. If you are not present at the time the docket is called by the Judge, your hearing will be rescheduled. The Judge cannot assist you with your divorce. You must know how to present your case in the courtroom.
